Stormwater Drainage Improvements

Jag Underground has been hard at work getting our new pipes put in for drainage improvements in town. The areas that were worked were:

Oklahoma & Choctaw

Oklahoma & Broadway

Cheyenne & Nebraska

Nebraska & Choctaw

Nebraska & Broadway (2)

Nebraska & Cherokee- Also with a new ditch as well as sidewalk replaced.

Drainage improvements by the Railroad track on Cheyenne with also fixing the asphalt from water erosion.

A new grate drain was put on Main Street across from Town Hall. Not included in the

grant but paid for by Capital Improvement Funding. Illinois & Cheyenne also received a new pipe due to 80% of that drain being collapsed. It was necessary to make the improvement before the next grant season. Sod was also added to each area. Jag did a wonderful job on this project! The full cost of completion was \$121,829.00
