**Improvement Plans** We held our Pre-Bid Conference on June 26<sup>th</sup> to discuss the scope of work to be completed. We had several companies pick up bid packets that were interested in the job.

All bids must be turned in by July 3<sup>rd</sup> by 2:00pm. We will not accept any late bids.

July 8<sup>th</sup>. The Drummond City Council will accept a bidder at 6:30 p.m. at our regular scheduled city council meeting.

The preconstruction meeting will be held August 4<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 p.m.

Notice to proceed will take place August 12<sup>th</sup>.

We expect the work to be completed by October 15<sup>th</sup> with 8 possible 9 locations that we are addressing.

These are the areas where work will be done. So please be patient with us while getting these completed.

1. Osage and Main Street
2. Nebraska And Cherokee Street
3. Nebraska and Broadway Street
4. Cheyenne and Nebraska Street
5. Broadway and Oklahoma Street
6. Choctaw and Oklahoma Street
7. Channel Improvement by County on Oklahoma Street west ditch
8. Cheyenne Street- This one we will have to see if there is approval by the Railroad.
